Bringing health service closer to their door steps gives them health care assurance. The Chiefs and people of Ashong officially welcome this initiative on the 18th November, 2016.

OUTREACH CLINICS

The outreach clinics in Batibo continue to assist the remote villages. Our preoccupation continues be that of equipping these micro health units or minimum care.

quite recently health care services were revamped in Upper Ashong since they were suspended some ten years ago due to lack of strategic focus. But since 2015 a lot of strategies have been directed towards this end.

It is for this reason that on the 18th November, 2016 the chiefs and people of Upper Ashong welcome in grand style the services of St John of God. The day started with Eucharistic celebration followed by statements and medical consultations.

A mini fundraising was organised to crown the occasion where the sum of 40,500Fcfa was raised on the spot in support of the health care activities. The centre has two staffs permanently working there. They are assisted by Health Management Committee selected from the various surrounding villages. So far over 86 consultations have been carried out in the centre and three deliveries conducted.

On the 28th December, 2016 the Health Management Committee was officially installed to start work. This was followed by some general and dental consultations. The visit of the medical team from St John of God Hospital in Batibo timely assisted one pregnant woman who could have experienced miscarriage. With St John of God Outreach, man don well, the woman and the family exclaimed.
